Nursery, Reception and Year 1



Uniform	
Boys:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Light blue shirt with school logo on the front • PE uniform shorts / navy shorts • White socks that cover the ankles • Black or white shoes/trainers with Velcro • Year 1 students may have lace-up or velcro • School sweater with school logo • School hat (with student's name embroidered on it)
Girls:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Light blue shirt with school logo on the front • PE uniform shorts /navy shorts or skort • White socks that cover the ankles • Black or white shoes/trainers with Velcro • Year 1 students may have lace-up or velcro • School sweater with school logo • School hat (with student's name embroidered on it)

Note: For our youngest students, **the naming of all uniforms is essential**. Names can be embroidered on items. Velcro shoes are also necessary as small hands find laces too tricky and big hands are sometimes too busy (this is an important safety issue too).

In addition, the following regulations must be adhered to:

Boys:

- Shorts must be worn at waist level
- Shoes must not have a "heel" (no boots allowed other than wellies or rainboots)
- Hair must be tidy and conservative in style and length (longer hair must be tied back or plaited - hair dyes of an unnatural colour are not allowed)
- A necklace displaying a religious symbol (e.g. a cross) may be worn under the shirt but absolutely no other jewellery is permitted (this includes earrings, rings, bracelets etc.)

Girls:

- Shoes must not have a "heel" (no boots allowed other than wellies or rainboots)
- Long hair must be tied back or plaited
- Hair clips, head bands or scrunchies must be white, black, or navy blue
- Clip-on hair extensions are not permitted
- A necklace displaying a religious symbol (e.g. a cross) may be worn under the shirt
- One pair of studded earrings may also be worn but absolutely no other jewellery is permitted e.g. rings, bracelets etc.)
- Make-up, nail polish and hair dyes of an unnatural colour are not permitted

In addition, the following regulations must be adhered to:

Boys:

- Shirts must be worn tucked in with the collars buttoned down
- Trousers or shorts must be worn at waist level
- Shoes must not have more than a 1” heel (no boots allowed)
- Hair must be tidy and conservative in style and length longer hair must be tied back or plaited – hair dyes of an unnatural colour are not allowed)
- A necklace displaying a religious symbol (e.g. a cross) may be worn under the shirt – absolutely no other jewellery is permitted (this includes earrings, rings, bracelets, etc.)

Girls:

- Blouses must be worn tucked in with the collars buttoned down
- The bottom of the skorts must touch the top of the knee (please consider buying these below the knee to allow for growth)
- Shoes must not have more than a 1” heel (no boots allowed)
- Long hair must be tied back or plaited
- Hair clips, head bands or scrunchies may be white, black, or navy blue
- Hair extensions or other clips are not permitted
- A necklace displaying a religious symbol (e.g. a cross) may be worn under the shirt
- One pair of studded earrings may also be worn (absolutely no other jewellery is permitted e.g. rings, bracelets, etc.)
- Make-up, nail polish and hair dyes of an unnatural colour are not permitted

Civvy Days (“Non Uniform” Policy)

“Civvy Days” (or Dress Down Days) are seen as valuable, motivational and important by both students and staff. Students are expected to respect the views of others and to follow the school’s “Non Uniform” policy. Students who break these guidelines or who, in the opinion of Senior Management Staff, are dressed inappropriately will either be sent home or removed from lessons that day.

Civvy Day attire should be modest and appropriate for the school environment. **Examples of inappropriate attire are as follows:**

Boys:

- Ripped jeans or pants
- T-shirts or hats with wording that is offensive to school staff or students
- Trousers worn below the hip
- Casual or Sport’s shorts (smart tailored shorts may be worn)

Girls:

- Excessively tight clothes
- Clothing that reveals bare stomachs or hips
- Skirts or shorts higher than the top of the knees
- T-shirts or hats with wording that is offensive to school staff or students
- Halter tops or spaghetti straps (without being covered with an over shirt)
- Ripped jeans or pants

Note: Civvy days are not allowed on days that students attend Mass. Also, normal jewellery, make-up and hair rules apply on Civvy Days.
