We invite applications from suitably qualified teachers for the post of **Subject Leader for Drama (KS1-5)**, to start in November 2020 or as soon as possible thereafter.

**Qualifications, Skills and Experience:**

- Bachelor's degree in Drama or equivalent from an accredited university, and a PGCE, QTS or other internationally recognised teaching qualification.
- At least 5 years of experience across Key Stages 3 – 5, with evidence of successful examination results at I/GCSE and A Level in recent years.
- Have recent experience and current knowledge of the English National Curriculum and the CIE/WJEC syllabus up to A Level, with evidence of successful examination results/positive value-added scores.
- Recent experience of directing a school drama and/or musical production.
- Leadership experience within a successful Drama department.
- Experience in teaching students or liaising with colleagues in a Primary school would be an advantage.
- An informed vision for the development of the subject in terms of improving teaching, learning and the use of assessment, curriculum development and raising standards of academic achievement across all key stages.
- Have a secure knowledge and understanding of excellent practice in teaching, learning and the effective use of assessment to improve learning, and be able to use data effectively.
- Be able to demonstrate impact of teaching on the progress of individual groups and cohorts of children.
- Experience of teaching an additional subject is preferred, therefore applicants should include such information within the application.
- Be committed to continued professional development.
- Be committed to Christ-centered values and beliefs.
- Model excellent practice in the classroom; preferably externally verified.
- Be proficient in using Microsoft Office/Office 365 products. Experience with SIMS would be an advantage.
- Have an excellent knowledge of Safeguarding and Child Protection good practice with recent, relevant training.
- Be an excellent team player committed to the Catholic ethos, values and aims of the school, and be committed to the holistic education of children.

**Duties will include, but will not be limited to:**

- To provide pastoral, academic, and behavioural support for children in accordance with school policies and procedures.
- To keep good records of progress of the children in the class/group and to be able to use the formal assessment processes of the school, both for formative and summative purposes.
- To support parents with referrals to outside agencies, where required.
- To meet with parents, staff, and children to provide support with Individual Education Planning and Learning plan support, where required.
- To provide communication to parents including writing of formal reports, and meeting with parents regarding their child's progress.
- Lead extra-curricular activities in Drama, including directing a school drama/musical production.

Salary range is CI\$43,499.00 - CI\$64,400.00 per annum commensurate with qualifications and experience based on the school's salary scale, plus one free school place for the child of an employee. Other benefits include medical insurance and contribution to a pension plan.
